PROSPECTUS

1. INTRODUCTION :

This recognised Co-Educational Senior Secondary School provides education from NURSERY to Class-XII on the NCERT pattern under the affiliation of CENTRAL BOARD OF SECONDARY EDUCATION, Delhi.

The School was started with primary classes. Later we opened the Junior Section. After that we got the permission from CBSE to start the Secondary Section in the year 1996. In 1998, CBSE granted us affiliation to upgrade the School upto the Senior Secondary Level for Science, Humanities and Commerce subjects and **the classes are going on under the Science stream.**

The aim of the school is to provide proper and best education to the children. The school imparts education in Primary, Junior, Secondary and Senior Secondary levels with the aid of latest Scientific apparatus and teaching aids under the guidance and supervision of highly qualified and experienced staff. Computer Education is given from Class- I onwards. We help our students to develop their personality on progressive lines with a comprehensive mental outlook and **विद्ययाऽमृतमश्नुते** self-confidence based on sound character and good conduct to face the future.

2. LOCATION :

The School is located on Gorakhpur-Sonauli Road, near Gorakhnath temple. The atmosphere is calm, peaceful and inspiring. It occupies an extensive park like area of about 3.00 acres. It is well planned with well ventilated, spacious class rooms and amenities.

3. SALIENT FEATURES :

We firmly believe in child- centred education and attempt to offer a unique opportunity for the optimum development of children by using the aid of latest psychological and scientific apparatus and teaching aids. The school seeks excellence in the field of learning and offers the latest audio-visual aids and provides educational equipments to create a suitable atmosphere for the all round development of children.

The school makes special arrangements for remedial classes for

4. CURRICULUM :

The course of study followed in the school is in accordance with the syllabus prescribed by the C.B.S.E., Delhi. The curriculum includes the following subjects.

Class IX & X :

English Language & Literature, Hindi Course-A, Mathematics, Science & Technology, Social Science, S.U.P.W. and Physical Education.

5. REGISTRATION / ADMISSION :

(a) Pre-Primary (Nry. & K.G. - I)

- (i) Admission of a child in pre-primary classes is made according to the age and merit of the child.
- (ii) The age limit as on 31st March is : **Nursery 3+ , K.G.-I. 4+.**
- (iii) Qualifying in an oral test as well as in the interview is a

prerequisite for gaining admission to Nursery.

- (iv) Written test starts from Class K.G.I in which only alphabets and numbers 1 to 20 will be tested / asked.

(b) Primary (I-V) :

The minimum age limit for **Class-I** (the first stage of primary) is **6+**. It goes on in the same way for other classes. There will be an admission test and interview for the candidates seeking admission in primary classes. **Admission test will be taken in English, Hindi and Mathematics.** A child who qualifies in the written test and interview but fails to fulfill the required age limit will not be given admission to the class which he / she desires.

(c) Junior (VI-VIII) :

Admission to junior classes will be permitted only after qualifying in a written test and in subsequent interview. Written test will be taken in curricular subjects like **English, Mathematics, Science** and **G.K.**

(d) Secondary (IX & X) :

A child must qualify in a written test and in subsequent interview for admission in **Class-IX**. The subjects for written test are **English, Mathematics, Science** and **G.K.**

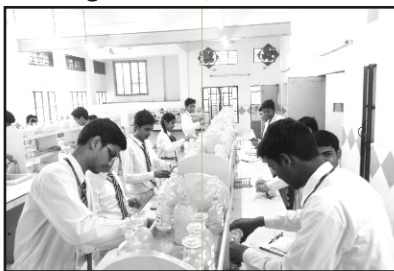
No admission is made to X & XII.

(e) Senior Secondary (XI & XII) :

(i) Admission to Class-XI is granted in May/June just after the declaration of result by the various Boards. A student who secures 80% marks in English, Mathematics & Science in CBSE of Class-X and 80% marks in these subjects in the case of ICSE, no matter what is the total percentage he/she secured in Board Exam., is eligible to register his/her name for the entrance test.

(ii) Entrance Test will be taken in English, Mathematics, Physics, Chemistry, Biology & Mental Ability. The candidates should qualify both written test and interview for considering their admission to Class-XI.

(iii) **Out of the subjects opted at the time of admission by the students of Class-XI can change subject once latest by 31st July. In case the details for registration, etc. are sent to**

CBSE earlier than 31st July, no request for change in subject will be entertained.

2. (a) Candidates taking admission in pre-primary/primary shall be valid upto class-V. For promotion to class-VI either the students shall have to secure minimum 60% of marks in all subjects in class-V annual examination or have to sit in the entrance test meant for outside students for admission in class-VI.

(b) Students studying in class VI or taken admission in class VI after qualifying in the entrance test shall be valid upto class- X. The students who have secured 85% of marks in English, Maths. & Science will have to seek fresh admission in class XI which is selective and at the discretion of the Principal. It will also depend on the general conduct and performance of the student during his/her stay in the school.

(c) Some of our own students want to continue in +2 level (Science Stream) inspite of getting poor marks in the Entrance Test Conducted by the school.

Guardians must be aware that from Class XI, the CBSE divided Education in 3 parts i.e., Science, Commerce & Humanities. From Primary of Secondary level, same pattern of education is given. But they are completely changed from class XI. Those who will like to join Science Stream must be strong in Math & Science. If they are weak in this field, they face big problem in the coming days. Ultimately, the chances are that they could not pass class XI. Therefore, the students and guardians request us to promote or take retest. Their only motive is that any how the students get promotion which is not possible. It is our suggestion to the students and guardians that if the student is not good enough in Math & Science, there is an option in CBSE that they can choose Commerce or Humanities. We hope they will prosper if they change over to Commerce or Humanities in the days ahead.

3. The list of the successful candidates will be displayed on the School Notice Board on the date given in the concerned notice.

4. Date and time for the written test will be assigned at the time of registration.

5. At the time of interview, candidates are required to bring any of the following identity proof :

- (a) Photocopy of the Report Card showing the result of Half-Yearly Examination.
- (b) Copy of the receipt of fee paid.
- (c) Identity card issued by the school.

6. PARENTS OF SUCCESSFUL CANDIDATES IN THE ENTRANCE TEST AND INTERVIEW SHALL REPORT TO OFFICE WITH THE FOLLOWING DOCUMENTS AND MUST MEET THE PRINCIPAL TOGETHER WITH THEIR WARD/S AT THE TIME OF ADMISSION (ON THE DATES AS NOTIFIED FOR THE PURPOSE)

- a) Photostat copy of the Birth Certificate from a competent authority.
- b) Two recent stamp size photographs of the student.

c) The admission will be provisional if transfer certificate & report card are not presented while taking admission. The guardians may, therefore, ensure that in order to make the admission final, these documents must be furnished before the commencement of the academic session.

d) **Guardian / Parents are requested to go through the following :-** At the time of admission, the registration or Admission form must be only filled by the parents/Guardians very carefully. **The content filled by the Guardians/Parents will not be changed in any case, especially the Student's Name, Father's Name, Mother's Name (Spelling and Name both) and Date of Birth.**

The form should be filled strictly according to the following information :-

- a) For Pre-Primary, according to the Birth Certificate issued by the Government Authority.
- b) From Class 1st and onwards, according to the previous school T.C. and other records.
- c) Only parents are allowed to collect the Registration form.

7. At the time of admission, admission fee alongwith monthly fee must be paid.

8. No request will be entertained for refund of fee in the event of

withdrawal of the candidate for what-ever reasons.

9. Dates for distribution of registration form, entrance test, declaration of result, admission, etc. will be displayed on the Notice Board. No application for any change in date for admission will be entertained.

10. Process for filling up of the vacant seats from the waiting list:

a) In the event of admission not taken by one or more successful candidates.

b) After 7 days of the starting of New Session if any student leaves on transfer, etc., against the vacancy of seat thus created.

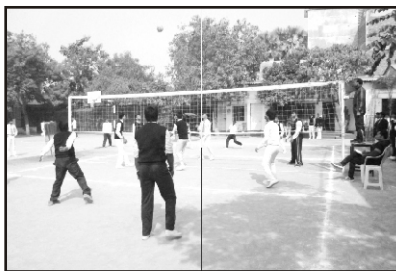
6. TRANSFER CASES :

(a) Officers who are posted at Gorakhpur on transfer may seek admission of their wards in our school. Their cases are considered subject to availability of seats and fulfilling of the conditions that they submit their applications alongwith photocopies of their transfer order and report card of the last Institution in respect of their wards within 15 days of the issue of transfer order or 7 days of assumption of charge at Gorakhpur.

(b) Admission process shall be the same as that of the general candidates, as laid down in the prospectus.

(c)(i) Entrance test will be held once in the **last week of April** in respect of the candidates whose applications are received upto one day before the date of the test. Similarly test may be conducted in the **last week of July** in the same process of the first test. No test will be conducted after July.

(ii) It is seen that guardians coming on transfer approach us for admission of their wards even after the second test of transferee candidates is over. In such cases it is clarified that in order to consider their cases, the transferee candidates will have to appear in the on-going examination of the School viz., Half Yearly Examination or other examination, if any. The candidates will be given the syllabus/Portion earmarked for the said examination. The candidates qualifying in such examination will be considered for admission against any vacant seat, if available.

(iii) No test will be held for individual cases.

(iv) The date of test will be notified on the notice board. Changes may take place if necessary.

(v) In the absence of any vacant seat, no new admission will be considered /taken into considerations. However, if guardians insist, the name of transferee candidate can be kept on waiting and if any seat falls vacant in the near future due to leaving of any student of the school for any reason, such case may be considered against the vacancy so created. Information in this regard will be displayed on the notice board and given to the candidate concerned over telephone.

(d) In normal cases admission is not done in Class - X & XII. So is the case with transfer cases.

(e) For further information, school office may be contacted.

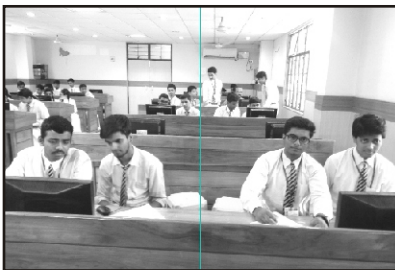

9. MORNING ASSEMBLY :

Morning assembly is held every day followed by "Thought for the Day" and "News" read by students and moral teaching by teachers. Regular P.T. is held after that. A brief time is also allotted to increase the general knowledge of our students.

10. ATTENDANCE :

1. Students must be punctual and regular in attendance.
Leave application must be submitted to Principal's office or to

class teacher. In case of illness and other unforeseen circumstances, the guardian should inform the Principal in writing within two days. A minimum attendance of 90% of the total working days is required during the academic year. A student returning to school after suffering from an infectious or contagious disease, should produce a doctor's certificate, permitting him/her to attend the school.

2. Every student must be present on the re-opening day after each vacation.

3. No leave other than Medical leave will be sanctioned during the examination. If any student falls ill particularly during examination, application for the same shall reach principal's office on the very date of falling ill. In case no application can be submitted, intimation may be given over phone and later the application may be submitted mentioning to whom information of illness was given.

4. Attendance is compulsory on National Festivals such as the "Independence Day", "Republic Day" etc.

11. DISCIPLINE :

Students are expected to maintain a high standard of good manners, behaviour and etiquette. If a child is found involved in any undesired activity or exhibiting an offensive attitude, she / he will be expelled from the school on charges of indiscipline.

English Speaking is a must. Students not adhering to this will be fined. Students can be expelled from the school any time if they fail to follow school rules.

12. CO-CURRICULAR ACTIVITIES & S.U.P.W.-(Every Saturday)

The school offers a variety of hobby classes and activities. Every student is supposed to take part and co-operate in the various school activities such as debating, delivering speech, essay writing, quiz etc. Additional arrangements for Music, Art, Dance, Model making, Clay work, Pottery, Gardening, Stitching and Embroidery etc. have been made for the students. These activities will help in carving out a

balanced personality in an individual to tide over adolescence safely into adulthood.

Our English and Hindi Literary Societies organise Debate, Declamation test, Quiz competition, Essay writing and Hand writing competitions. The Cultural Society organises competitions in Dramatics, Painting & Music.

NOTE : During SUMMER VACATION Hobby Classes viz. Gymnastics, Aerobic, Skating, Golf, Fencing, Martial Art, Yoga, Music, Instrumental Music, Dance, Embroidery, Stitching, Painting, Clay Work, Pottery, Fruit & Vegetable Carving, Training on Herbal Products, Cooking, etc. as per interest of the students with the consent of their parents, are taught.

13. SPORTS & GAMES :

(i) Education also includes physical development of the students. Keeping this in mind, we provide ample arrangements for Physical Education in this school. We have good facilities for different sports & games. These mainly include outdoor games such as Basket ball, Volley ball and Indoor games like Table Tennis, Badminton etc. Besides the above, we also train the students in Rifle shooting, Archery, Fencing, Golf, Gymnastics, Boxing, Yoga, Skating and martial arts like Karate, Tae - kwon - do etc. All these games would finally help the students to keep their body fit and mind fresh.

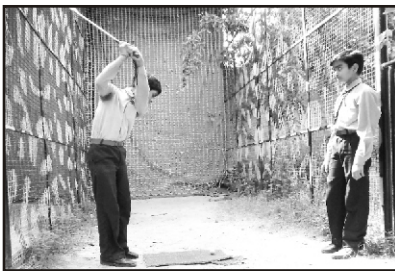
(ii) Although emphasis is given to sports and games yet first preference is earmarked to studies so that the result is not affected.

14. HOME-WORK :

Home-work in English, Hindi and Maths is given on alternate days. Parents / Guardians are requested to see that their children complete their home-work regularly.

15. INDIVIDUAL ATTENTION :

Effort are made to pay individual attention to all students in academic as well as in their physical, mental and moral development.

1. Progress of the students is assessed on the basis of unit tests, half yearly and annual examinations.
2. Promotion is granted on the basis of the entire year's work. The annual examination is meant to confirm the result of the year's work. The decision of the school authorities regarding promotion is final.
3. The syllabus for examination will be given one month before.
4. There will be no examination or re-examination out of schedule.
5. It is a must to obtain min. 35% marks in written papers of each subject besides pass marks in total for promotion to the next class.
6. Examinations of Classes X and XII are conducted by CBSE.

17. PICNICS & EDUCATIONAL TOUR :

Picnics & Tours to places of Educational, Historical, Geographical and Industrial importance are arranged.

18. AVAILABILITY OF FIRST AID / MEDICAL FACILITIES :

The school has opened a homoeopathic clinic to provide medical facilities to the students. An expert doctor's services will be available between 7:30 a.m. to 9:30 a.m. on all working days and on Fridays, apart from morning the doctor will be available in the afternoon also (Time : 1:30 p.m. to 4:00 p.m.) All the facilities have been arranged to give the students high level knowledge about First Aid with the help of all necessary equipments besides giving knowledge about health and hygiene, balanced diet, cleanliness, physical exercise etc.

(i) Parents are advised to intimate class teachers in writing if their wards have been suffering from diseases like jaundice, typhoid, etc. and are joining the school after recovery so that due care can be taken for them.

(ii) For Pre-Primary and Primary students, if guardians require that

their wards are to be given medicines during school hours, they should inform the respective class teachers so that follow up action can be arranged through the First Aid Incharge.

(iii) In case the students feel uneasiness or develop some sort of diseases during school time, they should report to the First Aid Room where the Incharge will take care of them and if feels necessary, will call the guardian over phone to take them home. In the event of serious illness, the school itself will take the ailing student to the nearby hospital and after treatment will take him / her home through the school vehicle.

For the above purpose it is necessary to provide the school, the local guardian's name, contact no. etc. and if the student is staying in hostel, warden's name, contact no. etc.

19. PARENT-TEACHER MEETING :

It is periodically organised in which discussion is done over child's educational and welfare matters.

20. RECOMMENDATION TO THE PARENTS :

1. Parents are expected to co-operate with the school authorities by ensuring that the children observe punctuality and discipline, neat & clean school uniform, prepare their lessons and take active part in the activities of the school.

2. Parents should check the School Diary and sign the reports recorded by the teachers and home-work given.

3. Parents / guardians are requested to keep themselves in touch with the school to have a clear knowledge of their wards' progress in studies.

4. In case on any particular day, parents need short leave for their wards for consulting Physicians, etc., they should not send their wards to school on that day.

5. The guardians are advised to provide correct telephone number so that they may be contacted by the school as and when needed.

6. Parents are not allowed to meet the teachers in the classroom or in the staff-room. Those who wish to seek information, suggestion or make complaint about their children's education or other matters may meet the Principal on the days and time given at point no. 23.

7. **Lunch Box :** The students shall carry their Lunch Boxes at the time of coming to the school. Lunch box shall not be accepted by the office for passing on the same to the particular student in any circumstances. Proper food should be provided. Avoid junk food.

8. School authorities will be responsible for the students only during school hours.

9. If the parents wish that their child shall be handed over to a particular person, then please submit three passport size photographs of the person to whom the ward is to be handed over duly attested by the parents alongwith an application for the purpose.

10. **Parents are informed that no half-day leave will be considered during Periodic Test/Unit Test.**

21. RELATION BETWEEN PARENTS AND CHILDREN

1. Harsh and coercive means of punishment should not be used in disciplining the children. They are to be trained through love and affection.

2. Help your children to set their own individual goals in life and then assist them to attain excellence in all the undertakings.

3. Do not allow your children to play out on the street with other kids and be very careful about the companion they keep.

4. Guardians are requested to ask their wards not to mix up with

any outsider while coming to school or on way back home. This will enable themselves to maintain gravity in relation with others.

22. RAINY DAY :

In order to decide Rainy Day, the following criteria will be taken into consideration :

- (a) "Rainy Day" will be declared if there is incessant rain till the starting of the school.
- (b) **If the rain stops 15 minutes before the beginning of the school then it will not be a "Rainy Day". The students coming late by half-an- hour on that day will be given entry to the school.**

NOTE : It is often observed that the guardians start asking over telephone right from 06:00 a.m. about the "Rainy Day". We can make them know only 15 minutes before the starting of school whether it will be a "Rainy Day" or not. So, please do not make unnecessary calls.

23. VISITING HOURS :

1. Parents can meet the Principal between **10:30 to 12:30 p.m.** on Tue., Wed., Thur. & Sat. **To see the Principal the guardians may use the visiting slip kept at the counter.**

2. Parents can also meet class teachers, subject teachers on all working days after the school hours.

24. FEE :

1. (i) The entires/parts fee that you have to pay in a session is divided into 12 month known as the composite fee.
- (ii) Composite fee will be paid as monthly basis. You can also pay Quarterly as per your convenience.

2. Fee can paid either online, through UPI or at the school office through CTS cheque. The cheque should contain name of the students, class, section & mobile number on its back side. Separate cheque for **Nry. to V** and **VI to XII** should be used to avoid accounting problem. Guardian having more than one ward in **Nry. to V** may use/issue one cheque. Similarly for students of Classes **VI to XII**, they may draw one cheque.

In the event of cheque being dishonoured, bouncing charges of Rs. 250/- alongwith the amount of cheque will be realised in demand draft.

3. Kindly get the receipt and keep it carefully.

25. FEE FOR NEW ADMISSION :

(i) At the time of **New admission**, one has to pay the admission fee alongwith the composite fee of one month, which is not refundable at any cost.

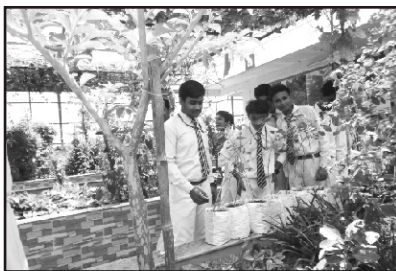
(ii) Those who take admission either in the month of May, June or any subsequent month, they have to pay fee for full session i.e. from April.

26. THE DAYS FOR COLLECTION OF FEE:

27. LATE PAYMENT :

If the fee is not paid within the stipulated date, it will be collected during the same period next month with late fee of Rs. 25/- per month.

If the fee is not paid continuously for 3 months the name of the defaulting student will be struck off the rolls and re-admission is to be sought for with an admission fee of Rs. 250/- only.

28. REGISTRATION :

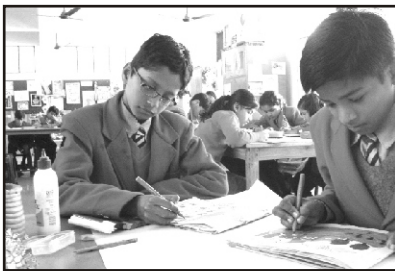

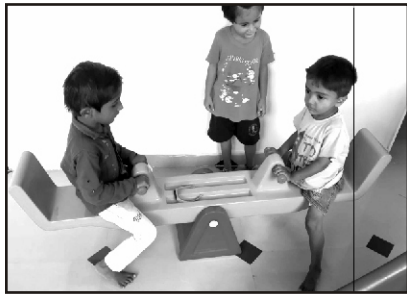

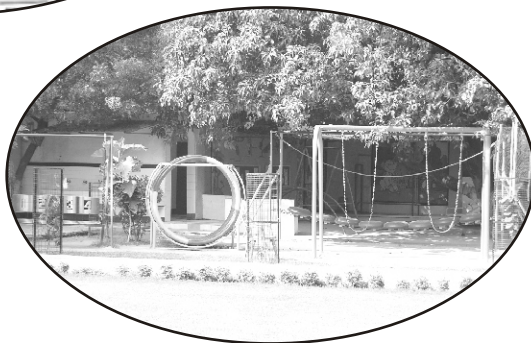
